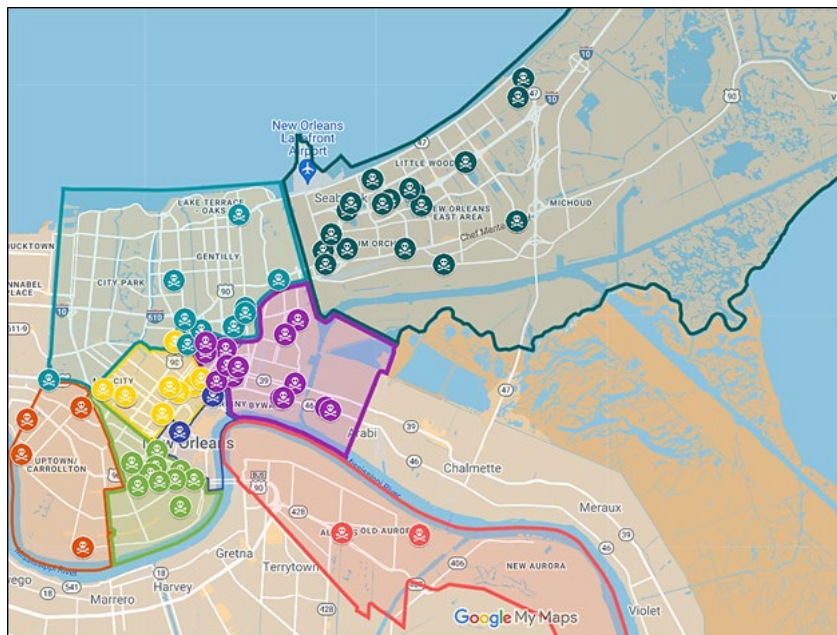

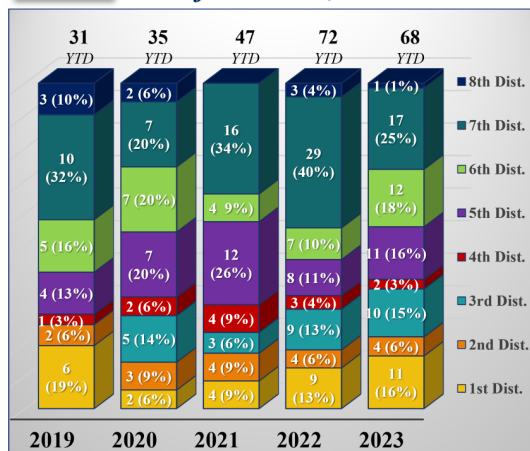

2019-2023 Homicide

The 6th District has shown the largest increase in homicide since 2022 (+71%), accounting for 18% of all homicides as of Q1 2023.

1st District shows a consistent and substantial increase in the number of homicides, particularly since 2020 – despite small size and population, the 1st District accounted for 16% of Q1 homicides in 2023. Treme/Lafitte neighborhoods shows the highest concentration of homicides in the 1st.

7th District consistently has more homicides than other NOPD districts, BUT this district has seen a 41% decline since 2022.

5th District increased 10% since last year but barely made the top 3 worst districts for homicide in 2023. Many homicides in the 5th District are concentrated in the St. Roch/Seventh Ward neighborhoods.

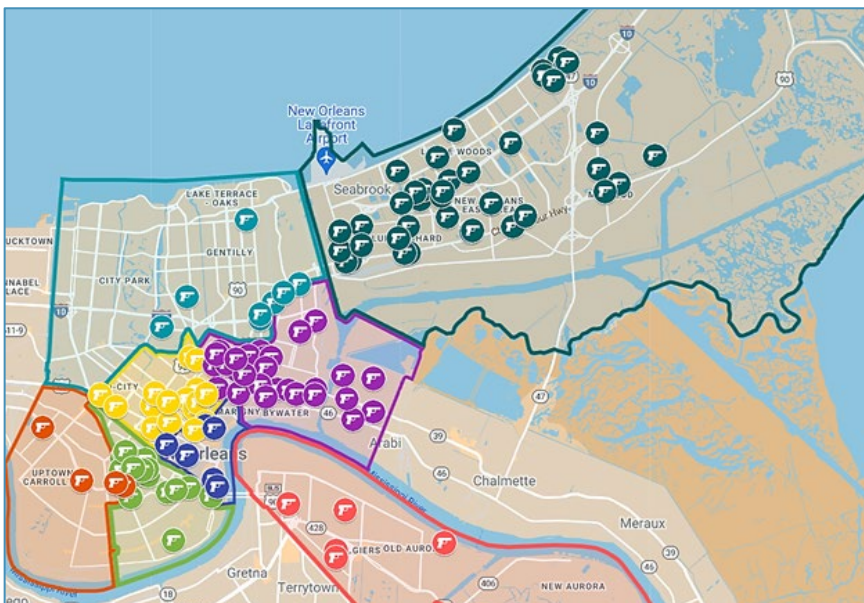

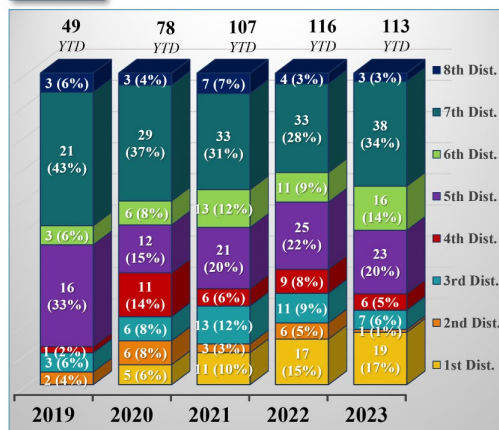

2019-2023 Shooting

Shooting incidents have shown alarming rates of increase in both the **1st** and **6th** Districts over the last 4 years.

1st District shooting incidents account for 17% of all shooting incidents, mostly in the **Treme/Lafitte** neighborhoods and the **Seventh Ward**.

6th District have increased by 45% since last year and account for 14% of Orleans' shooting incidents as of the end of Q1. Larger concentrations are noted in the **Hoffman Triangle** neighborhood.

3rd District shooting incidents are highly concentrated along the **I-10/610 corridor**, near the edge of the **Gentilly** neighborhood.

5th District shootings account for 20% of Q1 shooting incidents, largely concentrated in **St. Roch** and **St. Claude** neighborhoods.

7th District accounts for 34% of Q1 shootings. Many incidents are reported in certain areas of the **Pines Village** and **Plum Orchard** neighborhoods, as well as auto body shops along **Chef Highway**.

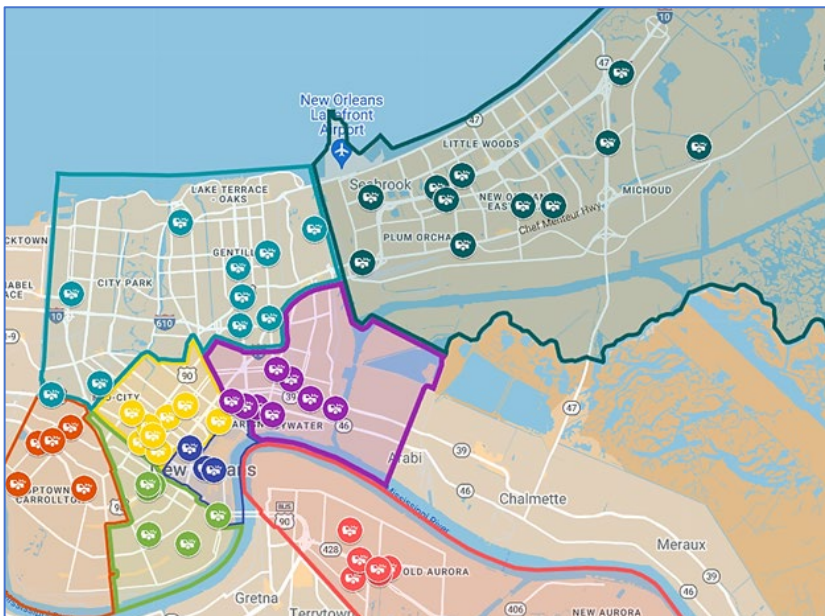

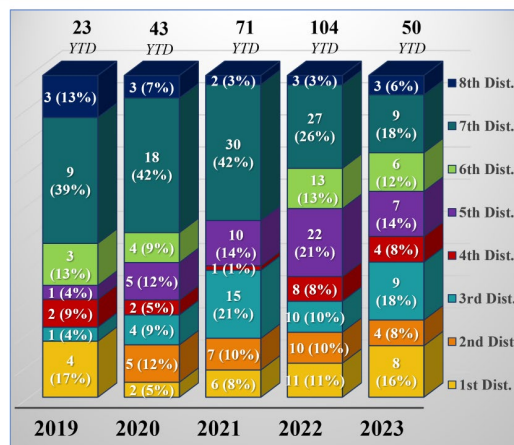

2019-2023 Carjacking

Carjacking incidents have dropped considerably citywide compared with 2021-2022.

While the 3rd District had the highest rate of reported carjacking at the end of Q1 2023, no district had reported more than nine carjacking incidents as of March 31, 2023.

Hotspot neighborhoods include:

- Carrollton/Hollygrove in 2nd District.
- Central City in 1st District.
- Gentilly Woods in 3rd District.
- General DeGaulle/Behrman in 4th District.

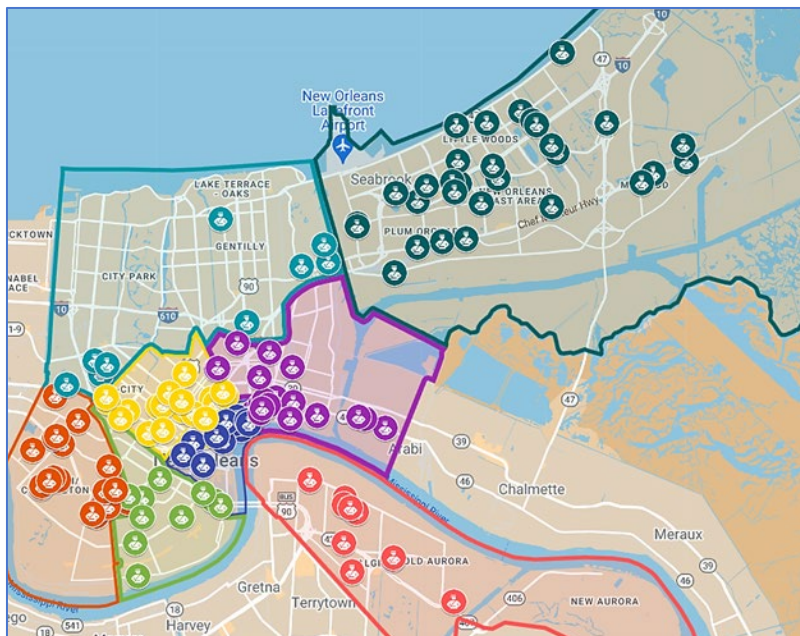

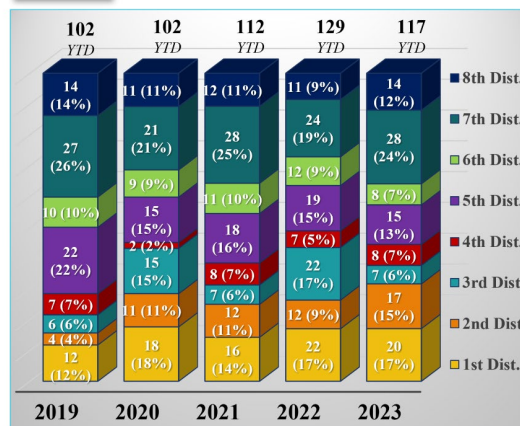

2019-2023 Armed Robbery

Despite a small decline (-19%) during the COVID-19 lockdown, armed robbery has remained remarkably stable across the 5-year period.

3rd District armed robbery has shown the largest decline since 2022 (-68%)

2nd District armed robbery has shown the largest increase since 2022 (+42%)

The 8th District typically has a higher rate of armed robbery than other types of major violent crime – as of the end of Q1 2023, 12% of the city's armed robberies occurred in the French Quarter/Warehouse District neighborhoods in the 8th District.

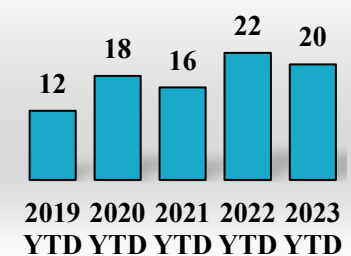

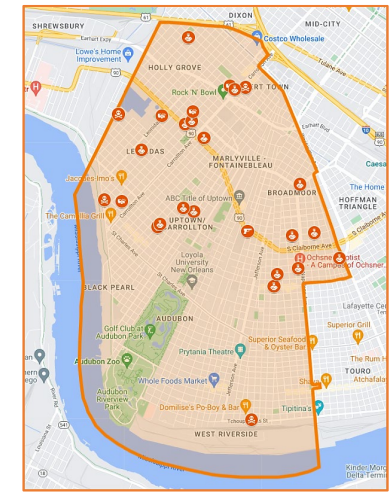
Of note, the 2nd District ranks 3rd among the 8 NOPD Districts in reported ARMED ROBBERY incidents.

Only armed robbery continues to show upward trends in the 2nd District compared with 2019-2022 Q1 rates

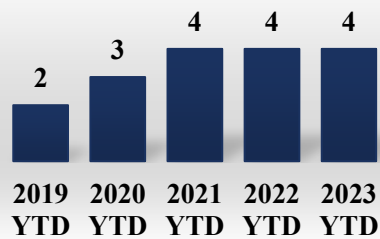

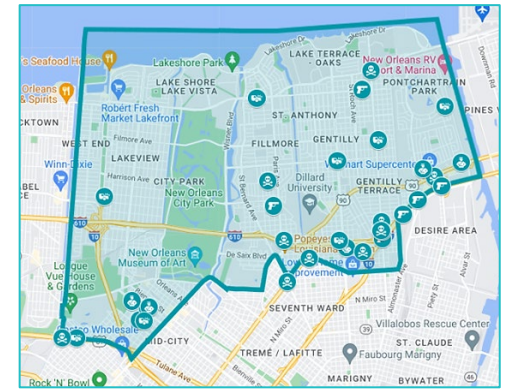

At the end of Q1 2023, the 3rd District ranked #1 of 8 districts in **CARJACKING** rates, accounting for 18% of reported 2023 Q1 carjacking.

In contrast, **ARMED ROBBERY** rates in the 3rd District have decreased 68% since 2022 – numbers are lower than any other NOPD District, accounting for 6% of total reported armed robberies.

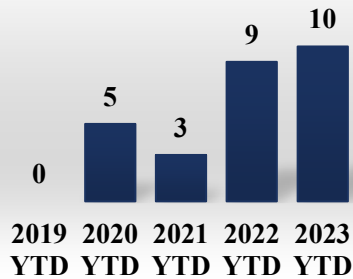

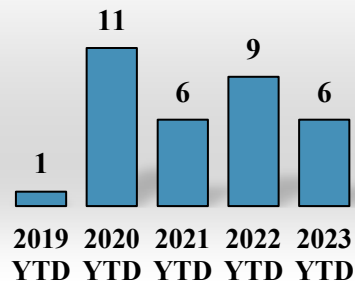
The 4th District is typically one of the lower districts with regard to reported violent crime.

Aside from a spike in nonfatal SHOOTING incidents in 2020, there have been no major shifts in violent crime in the 4th District since 2019.

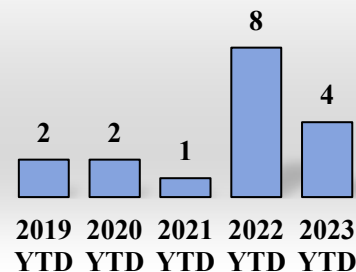

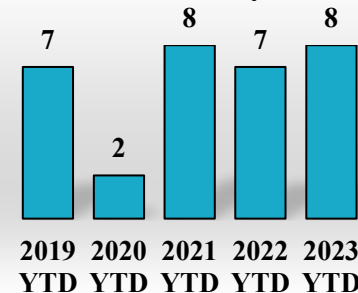

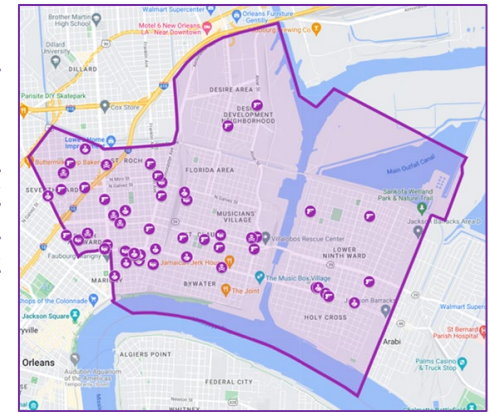
In 2021-2022, the 5th District was among the top two NOPD Districts for nearly all categories of major violent crime.

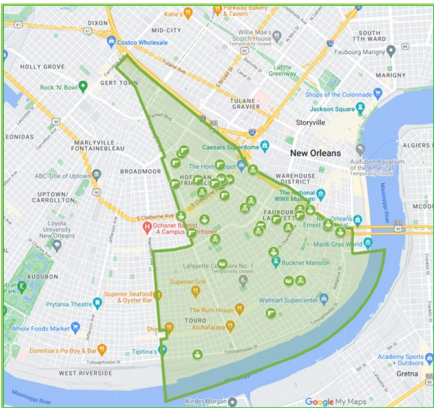
The 6th District has shown the largest increase in HOMICIDE since 2022 (+71%).

At the end of Q1 2023, the 6th District accounted for 18% of Orleans' homicides, second only to the 7th District

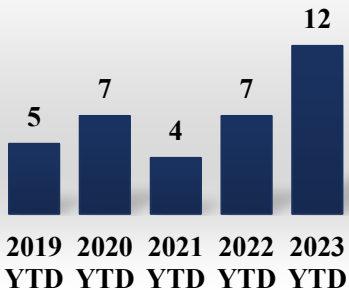

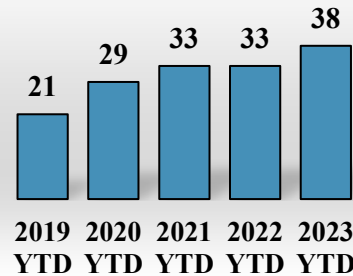
HOMICIDE is down in the 7th District by 41% since 2022. At the end of Q1 2023, the 17 reported homicides accounted for 25% of the Q1 total.

In contrast, at the same time in 2022, 29 homicides had occurred in the 7th District, accounting for 40% of the YTD total.

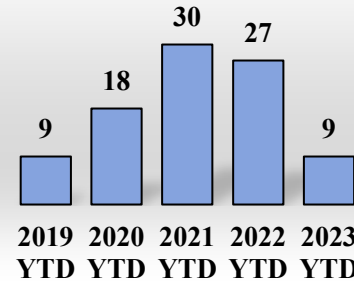

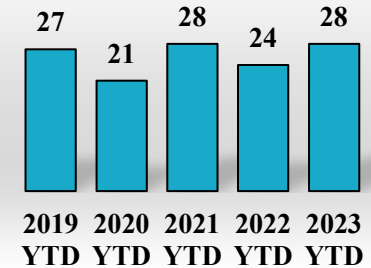

Due in part to its small size and population, the 8th District consistently ranks among the lowest for reported violent crime.

However, the high tourist concentration in this area (e.g., French Quarter) leads to higher rates of ARMED ROBBERY. As of the end of Q1 2023, the 8th District ranked 5th out of 8 NOPD districts on armed robbery.
