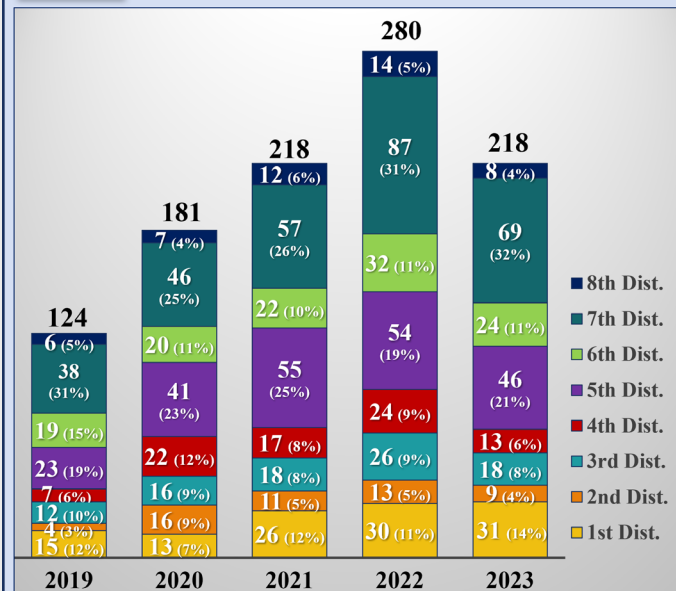

-22% citywide

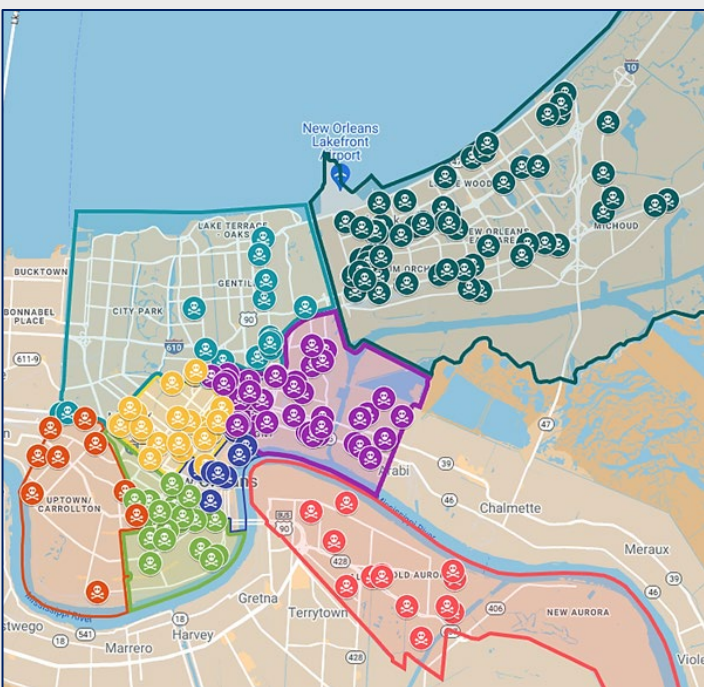
2022 Homicide: 280

2023 Homicide: 218

- Although **7th District** homicide dropped **-21%** from 2022-2023, this district accounted for nearly one-third (**32%**) of 2023 homicide.
- The **5th District** accounted for **21%** of 2023 homicide despite a **-15%** decline.
- Only the **1st District** increased (**+3%**) in homicide from 2022-2023.
- Over two-thirds of 2023 homicides occurred in either the 1st, 5th, or 7th Districts.**

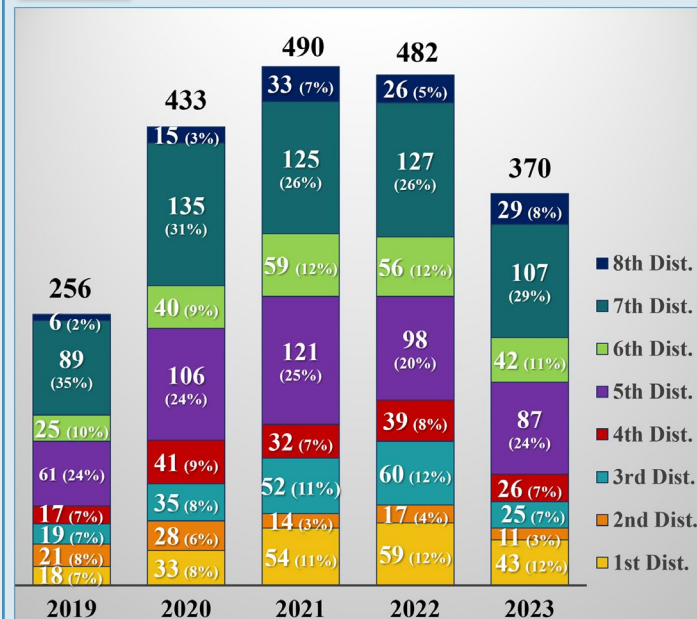

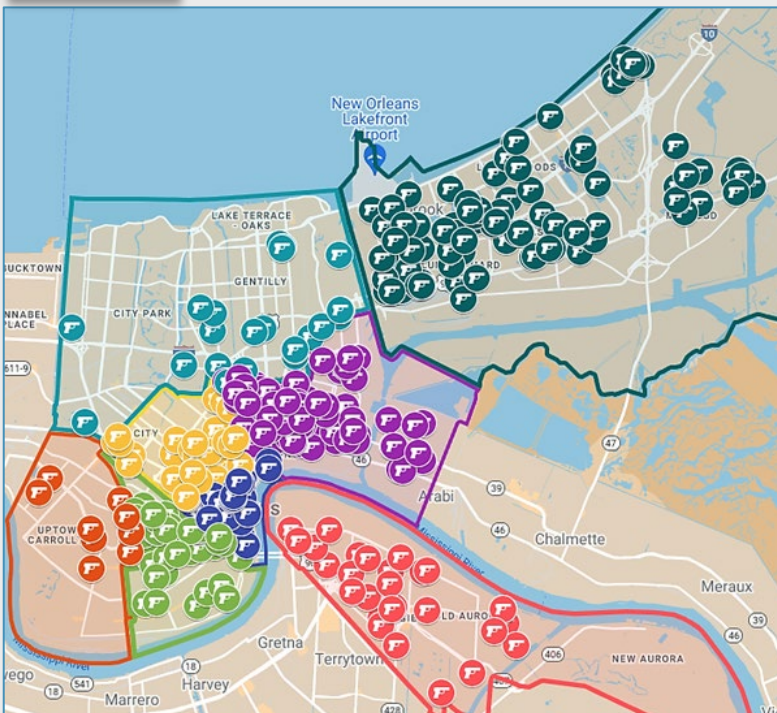
2022 Shooting: 482

2023 Shooting: 370

- More than half (53%) of nonfatal shootings in 2023 occurred in either the 7th District (29%) or the 5th District (24%)
- The 3rd District showed the highest rate of decline (-58%) from 2022-2023.
- Notably, the 8th District increased +12% from 2022-2023, the only NOPD district to increase in nonfatal shootings compared with 2022.

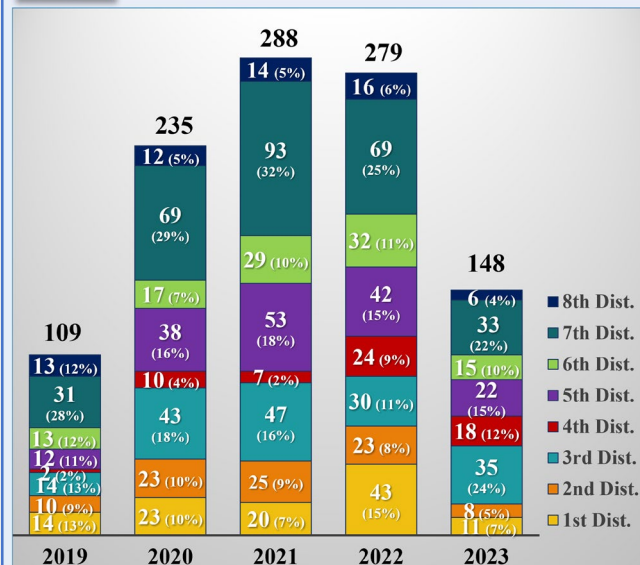

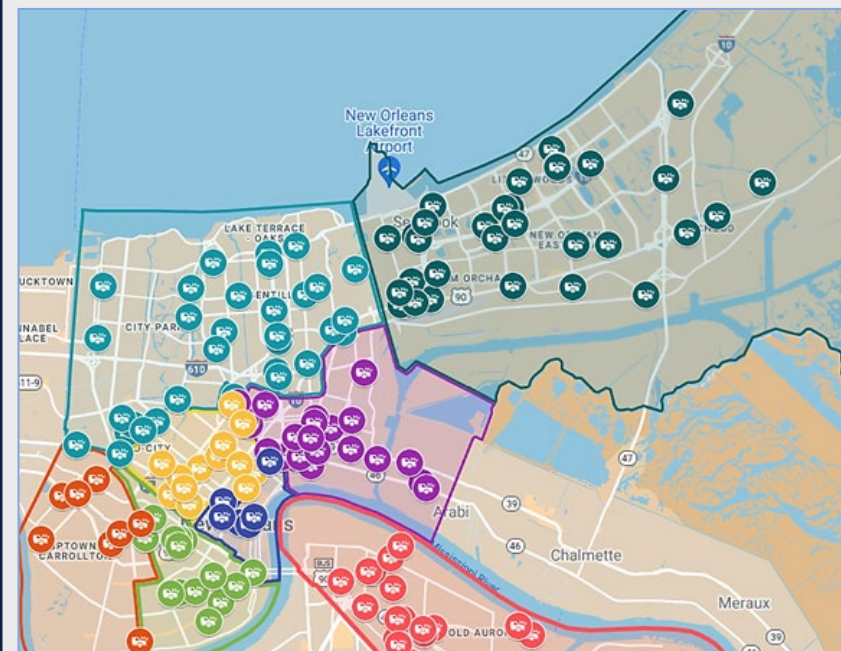
2022 Carjacking: 279

2023 Carjacking: 148

- Carjacking declined more than any other category of major violent crime from 2022-2023.
- Notable decreases include the **1st District** (-74%), the **2nd District** (-65%), and the **8th District** (-63%).
- Notably, the **3rd District** increased **+17%** from 2022-2023, ranking 1st of the 8 NOPD districts in 2023 carjacking incidents.

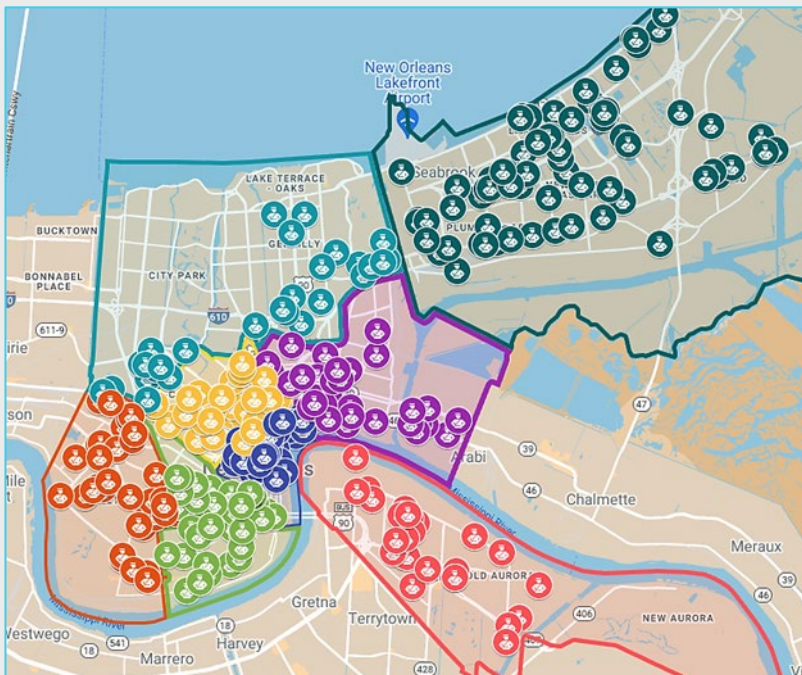




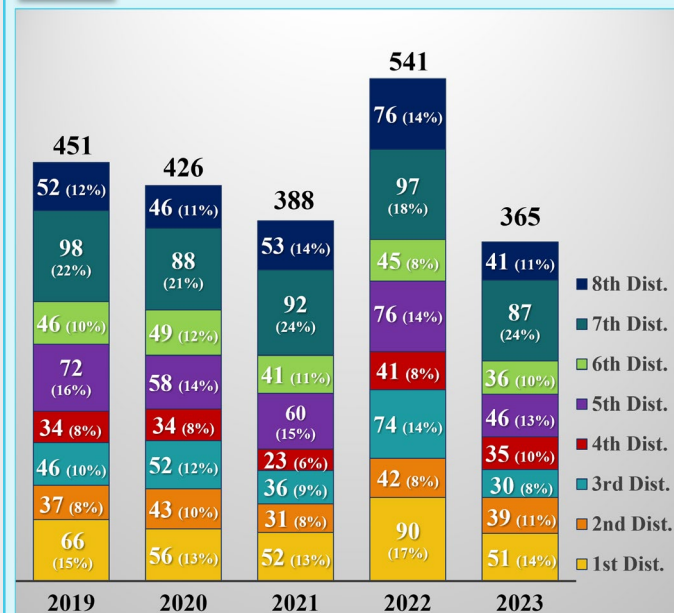

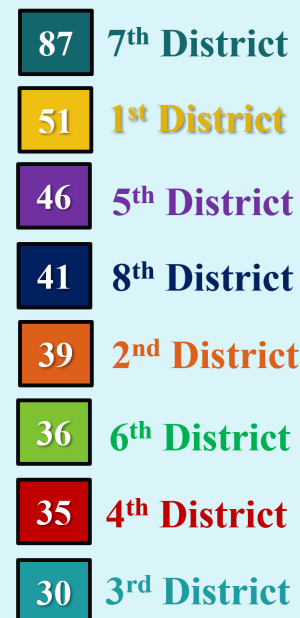

2022-2023 ARMED ROBBERY Trends

-33% citywide

2022 Armed Robbery: 541

2023 Armed Robbery: 365

- Armed robbery is the only category of major violent crime to show decrease compared with all 4 prior years.
- The **3rd District** showed the largest decline (-59%), from 74 in 2022 to 30 in 2023.
- The **2nd District** showed the smallest decline (-7%), from 42 in 2022 to 39 in 2023.

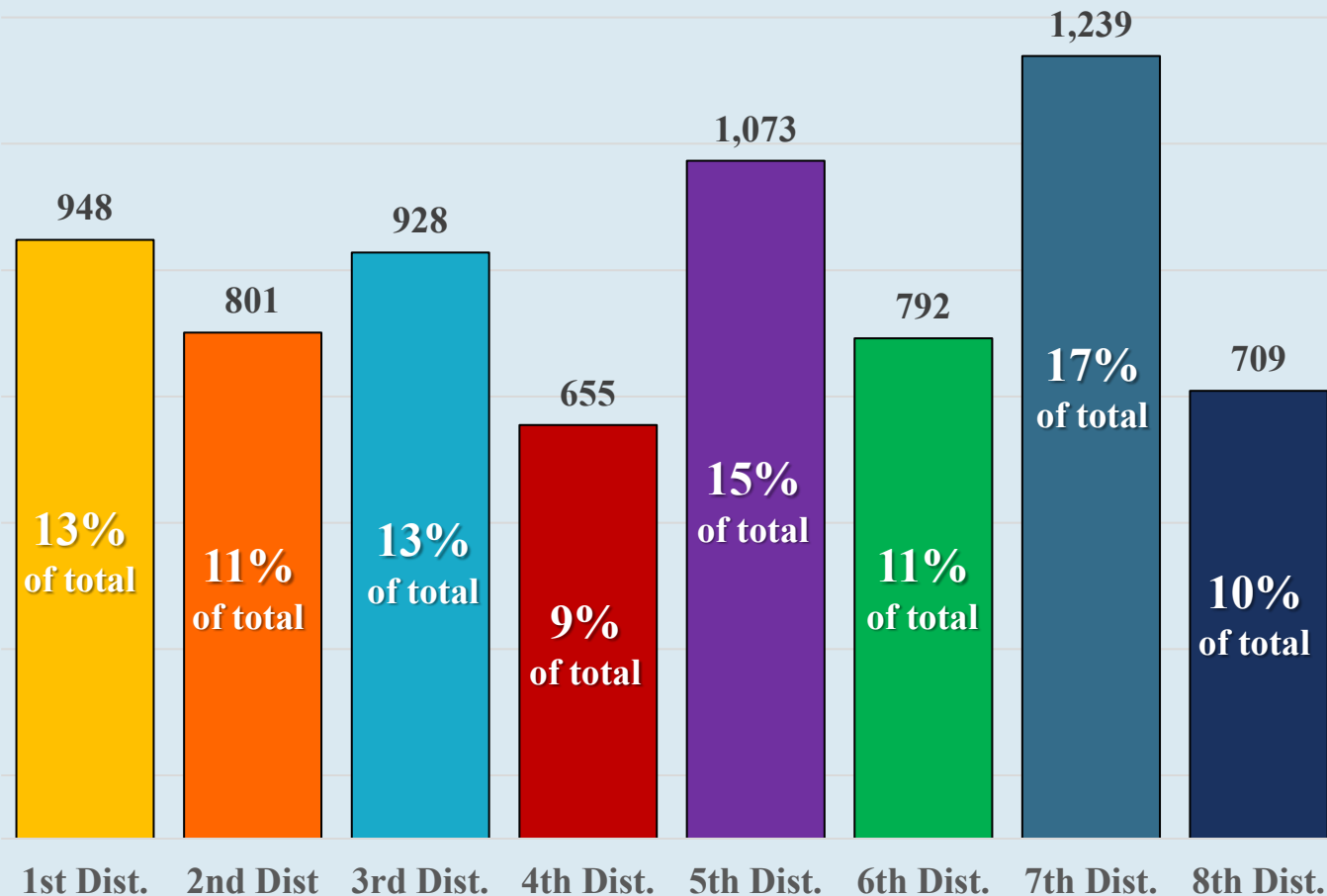
