


Aggregate citywide incidents of homicide, nonfatal shooting, carjacking, and armed robbery declined -21% from Q2 2024- Q2 2025.


Since reaching a high watermark of 816 YTD violent incidents in 2022, major violent crime declined -64% to 294 reported incidents in 2025.

The 2nd District (-32%) had the highest rate of decline across the 8 NOPD Districts between Q2 2024 and Q2 2025. All NOPD Districts declined in aggregate violent incidents.

The 7th District ranked highest in aggregate violent crime in Q2 of 2025. accounting for 25% of citywide violent crime.

At 21 violent incident reports, 1st District and 2nd District each tied for the fewest violent incidents in Q2 of 2025.


Citywide, homicide declined -13% from 2024-2025. Since reaching a high watermark of 156 YTD homicides in 2022, there has been a -58% decline.

Nearly one-quarter (24%) of citywide homicides occurred during the January 1st Terrorist Attack on Bourbon Street, which claimed the lives of 14 victims in the **8**th **District**.

Since January 1st, the 8th District has not had a single homicide.

The 1st District and 4th District showed **no change** in homicide between Q2 2024 – Q2 2025.

The 3rd District increased from 3 homicides through Q2 2024 to 7 through Q2 2025.



Since reaching a high watermark of 261 shootings through Q2 in 2021, citywide nonfatal shooting declined -62%. Citywide, nonfatal shooting declined -20% between Q2 2024 and Q2 2025.

The 100 nonfatal shooting incidents through Q2 of 2025 were the fewest over the past seven years.

The 5th District showed the largest (-50%) reduction in nonfatal shooting since Q2 2024. Other substantial declines are seen in the 4th District (-40%) and 6th District (-39%).

At 32 YTD shootings, the **7**th **District** was higher relative to other NOPD Districts, accounting for 32% of citywide nonfatal shootings through Q2 2025.


NOPD DISTRICT-LEVEL <u>Carjacking</u> Trends

AS OF JUNE 30, 2019-2025



Since reaching a Q2 high of 154 in 2022, citywide carjacking incidents declined -79% through Q2 2025. Compared with Q2 2024, carjacking declined -33%.

The **5**th **District** reported the highest number of carjackings through Q2 2025, however no NOPD District surpassed 10 carjackings in the first 6 months of 2025.

DISTRICT-LEVEL Armed Robbery Change 2024-2025

Citywide armed robbery declined -22% since Q2 of 2024. Since reaching a high of 269 reported robberies through Q2 of 2022, armed robbery decreased -64% citywide.



Despite slight increases in the 4th District (+27%) and 6th District (+10%), the 96 YTD armed robbery reports are the fewest across the past 7 years.

The **8**th **District** showed the greatest improvement compared with Q2 of 2024, decreasing **-68**% from 25 to 8 reported armed robberies through Q2 of 2025.

The **5**th **District** remained steady, with 21 reported armed robberies through Q2 in 2024 and 2025. The **5**th **District** is a persistent hotspot, with the most armed robberies of any NOPD District through Q2 in 2025.

As of June 30, 2025







The 1st District experienced a modest overall drop in violent crime (-16%), tying with the 2nd District for the fewest incidents citywide in Q2 2025.

The 1st District saw a **+50%** increase in **nonfatal shootings**, although this represents an increase of only 3 incidents.

Carjacking declined -83%, and homicide remained stable with no year-over-year change.


Armed robbery also declined **-22%**, continuing a multi-year downward trend.









The 2nd District showed the most substantial reduction in overall violent crime across the city, with a -32% year-over-year drop.

The 2nd District tied with the 1st District for the fewest violent incidents in Q2 2025.

Homicide fell by -43% and carjacking by -57%.

Although nonfatal shooting increased slightly (+17%), the 2nd District is tied with the 8th District for having the fewest nonfatal shooting incidents through Q2 of 2025.

Armed robbery reached a six-year low in the 2nd District in Q2 of 2025.









However, this district has seen considerable reductions across all categories of major violent crime since Q2 2021 (-71%), 2022 (-75%), and 2023 (-63%).

The +133% increase in homicide can be largely accounted for by an uptick in hit-and-run/vehicular fatalities in 2025.

Nonfatal shooting remained steady, while both carjacking (-50%) and armed robbery (-33%) show consistent decline.





The 4th District continues to see long-term improvements in violent crime but has the third highest rate of armed robbery across the eight NOPD Districts.

Overall violent crime in the 4th District dropped by -14%, with strong declines in nonfatal shooting (-40%) and carjacking (-29%).

Homicide remained unchanged since Q2 in 2024.

However, the 4th District experienced a **+27%** increase in **armed robbery**, contrary to citywide trends.





The 5th District saw a substantial (-28%) reduction in overall violent crime as well as in homicide and nonfatal shooting compared with Q2 in 2024.

Since peaking in 2021-2022, both **homicide** (-24%) and **nonfatal shooting** (-50%) have shown sustained improvements.

Carjacking declined -13%, a difference of one incident.

However, the 5th District reported the highest rate of **armed robbery** citywide for Q2 2025 (21 incidents) and remains a persistent hotspot for armed robbery.







The 6th District showed substantial improvements in homicide (-64%) and nonfatal shooting (-39%), contributing to a -24% overall drop in violent crime.

While the 6th District had the highest percentage increase in **carjacking** across the eight NOPD Districts, The **+150**% increase in **carjacking** is a difference of only 3 incidents.

Similarly, the **+10%** increase in **armed robbery** represent a difference of only a single incident.

There is a relatively large concentration of violent incidents in the 6th District's Central City/Hoffman Triangle neighborhoods.





The 7th District continues to report the highest total number of violent crimes citywide, accounting for 25% of all incidents in Q2 2025.

Despite a -15% drop in total violent crime, the 7th District had the most homicides and nonfatal shootings through Q2 of 2025.

Homicide declined -32% while nonfatal shooting showed a small (+10%) increase compared with Q2 in 2024.

Since reaching a high watermark of 57 **carjacking** incidents through Q2 in 2021, the 7th District declined by **-89%.** Compared with Q2 in 2024, 7th District **carjacking** declined **-45**%.



The 8th District has had an anomalous year due to the January 1st terrorist attack that killed 14 people—nearly a quarter of citywide homicides YTD.

As a result of the attack, **homicide** rose **+88%**. Since January 1, 2025, there have been no homicides in the 8th District.

Nonfatal shooting declined -22% and carjacking incidents showed no change compared with 2024.

Armed robbery declined -68%, the largest reduction citywide in comparison to Q2 in 2024.
