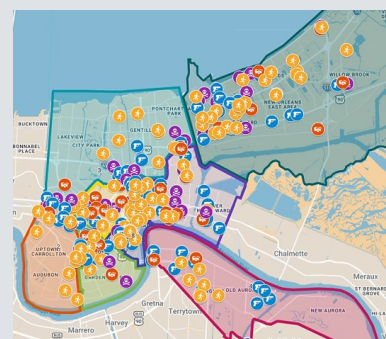
Aggregate incidents of homicides, nonfatal shootings, carjackings, and armed robberies continued to decline across the past 4 years. **Through the first two quarters of 2026, the city recorded 247 reported major violent incidents. This represents a decline of -70% (569 fewer incidents) since 2022 and -15% decrease (45 fewer incidents) since 2025.**

The **7th District** experienced the largest long-term reduction in violent crime, with **153 fewer incidents (-74%) in 2026 compared with 2022.** Compared with 2025, the **7th District** reported **18 fewer incidents (-25%) in 2026.**

The **8th District** reported **18 fewer incidents** in 2026 after the January 1, 2025, Bourbon Street Terror Attack claimed 14 homicide victims.

In contrast, the **1st District** reported **+10 more incidents** during 2026 compared with 2025, the largest increase across the eight NOPD Districts.

The **5th District** and **7th District** have consistently accounted for a disproportionately high rate of citywide violent crime, ranging from 41%-45% since 2022.



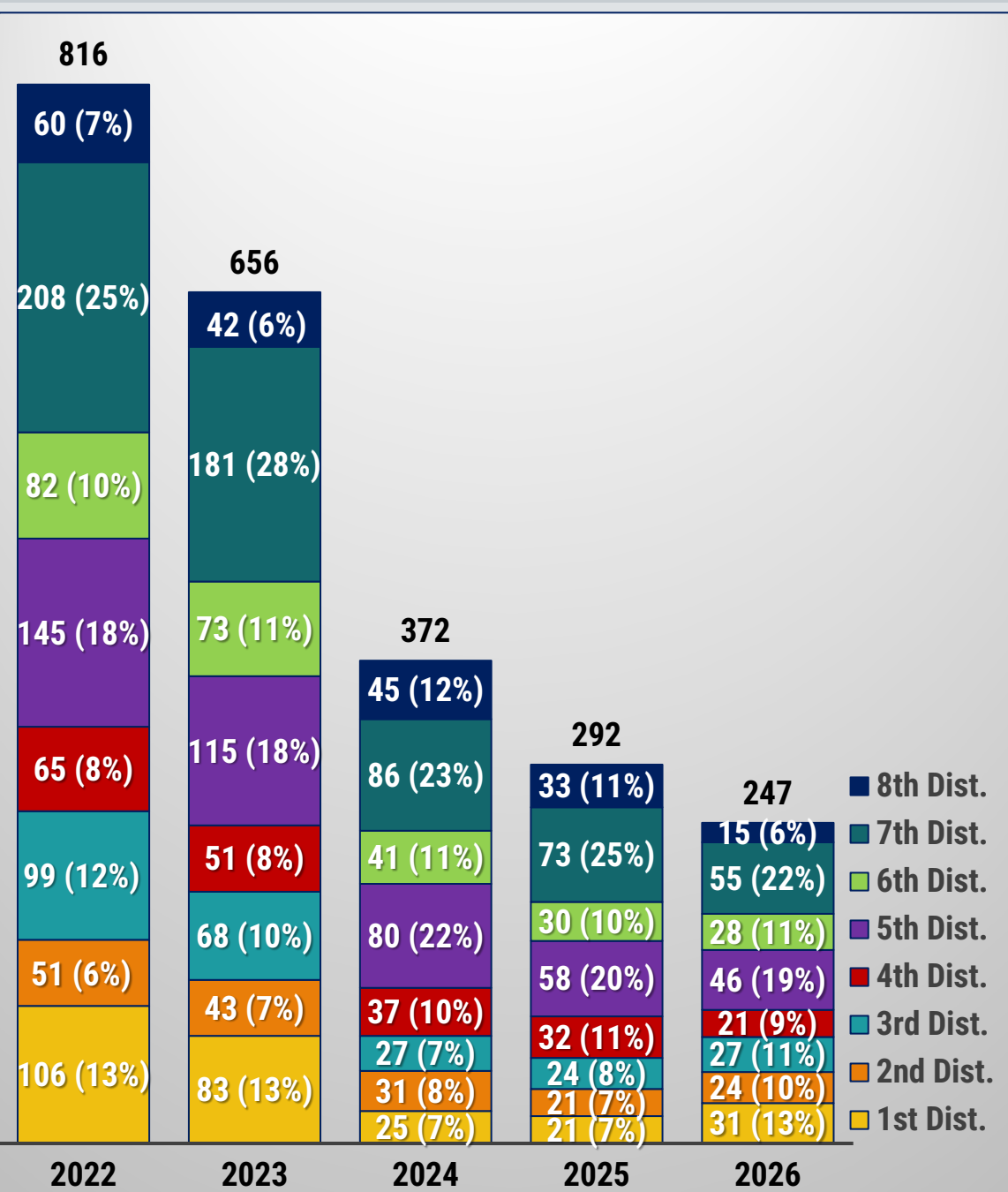

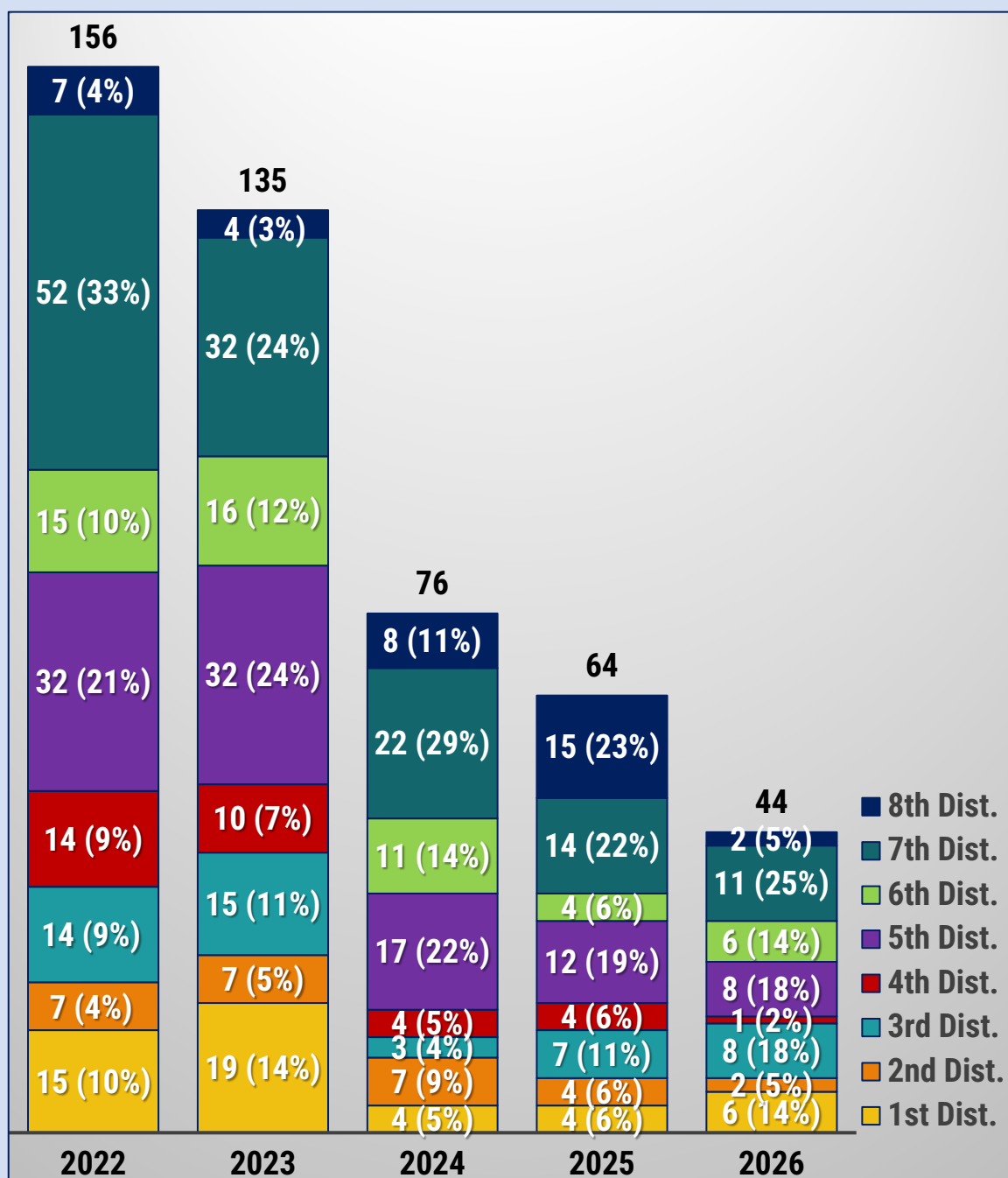

Citywide, homicide has declined -72% since 2022, a difference of 112 fewer victims in the first six months of 2026. Compared with the same time in 2025, there have been **20 fewer victims** in 2026 (-31%). The Bourbon Street Terrorist Attack in the **8th District** accounted for 22% of citywide homicides in the first six months of 2025.

The **1st District** and **6th District** each increased from four homicide victims in 2025 to six homicide victims in 2026 (+50%). The **3rd District** increased by one victim from 2025-2026 (+14%).

While still ranked highest at 11 homicides (25% of citywide total), the **7th District** has shown substantial improvements since 2022, with **41 fewer victims** in 2026 (-79%). The **7th District** had three **fewer victims** in 2026 compared with 2025 (-21%).

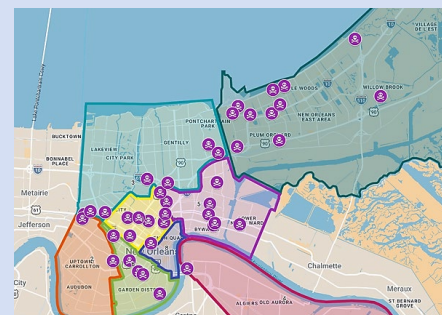
The **4th District** reported a single homicide in the first six months of 2026, which represents the lowest number of any NOPD District over the last five years (2022-2026).

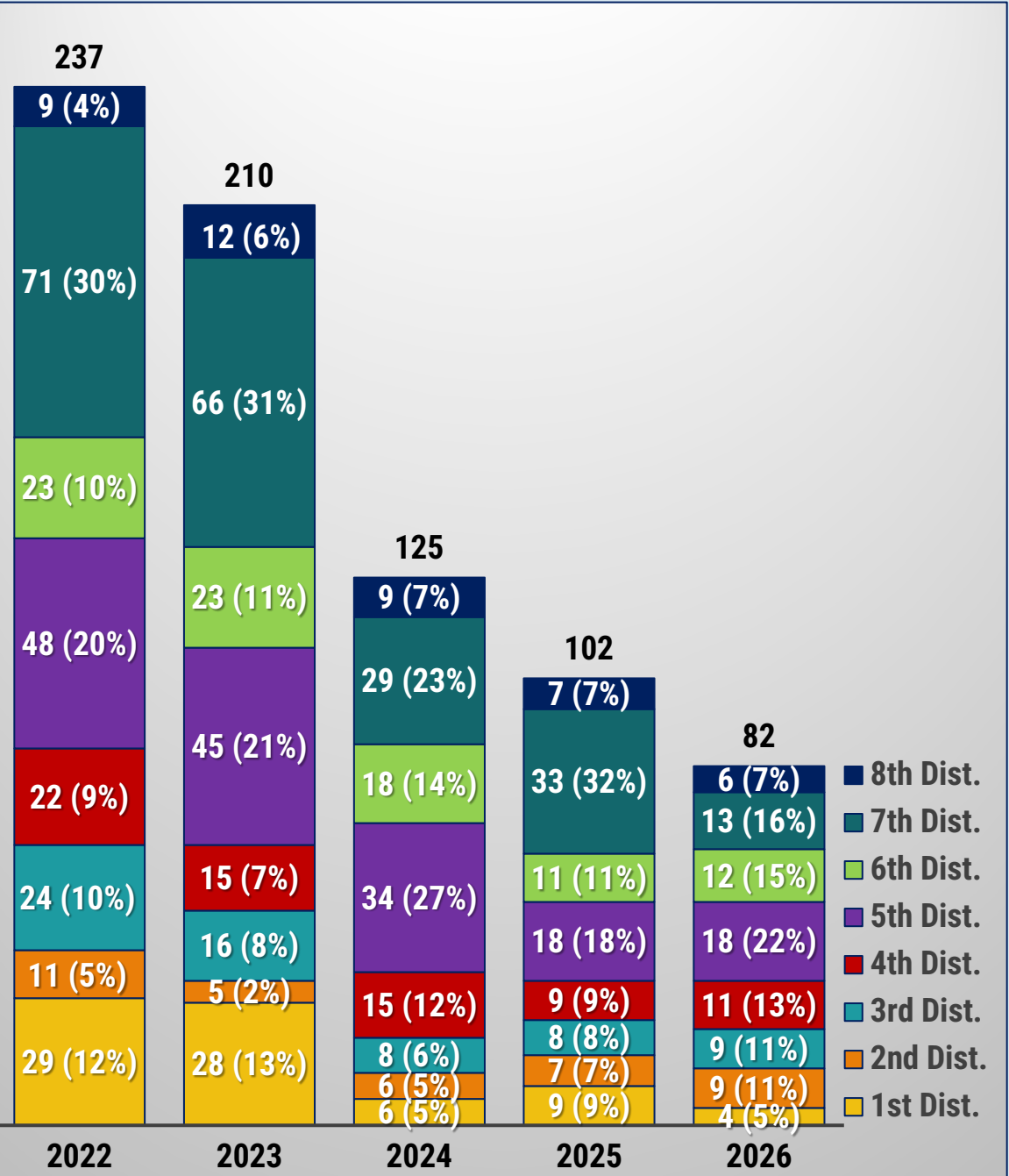

Since reaching a five-year high of 237 incidents in 2022, nonfatal shooting declined to 82 (-65%), a difference of 155 fewer nonfatal shootings, in 2026. Citywide shooting incidents declined by 20 incidents from 2025-2026 (-20%).

The 7th District showed the largest reduction, with 20 fewer nonfatal shootings compared with 2025 (-61%) and 58 fewer nonfatal shootings compared with 2022 (-82%). The 1st District had five fewer nonfatal shootings compared with 2025 (-56%).

At 18 nonfatal shootings, the 5th District has had the highest number of nonfatal shooting incidents of the eight NOPD Districts in 2026.

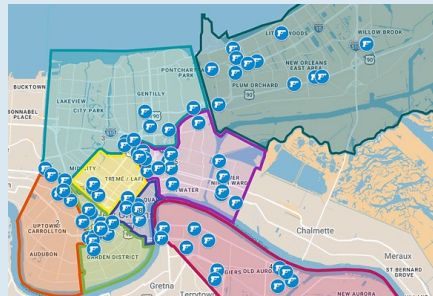
The 2nd District and 4th District each had two more nonfatal shooting incidents in 2026 compared with 2025 (+29% and +22%, respectively). The 3rd District and 6th District each had one more nonfatal shooting in 2026 than in 2025 (+13% and +9%, respectively).

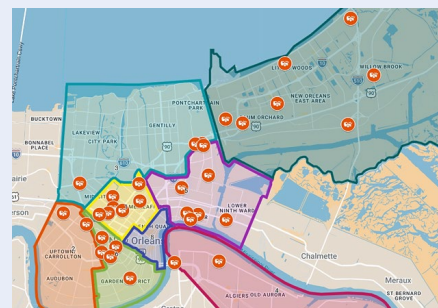

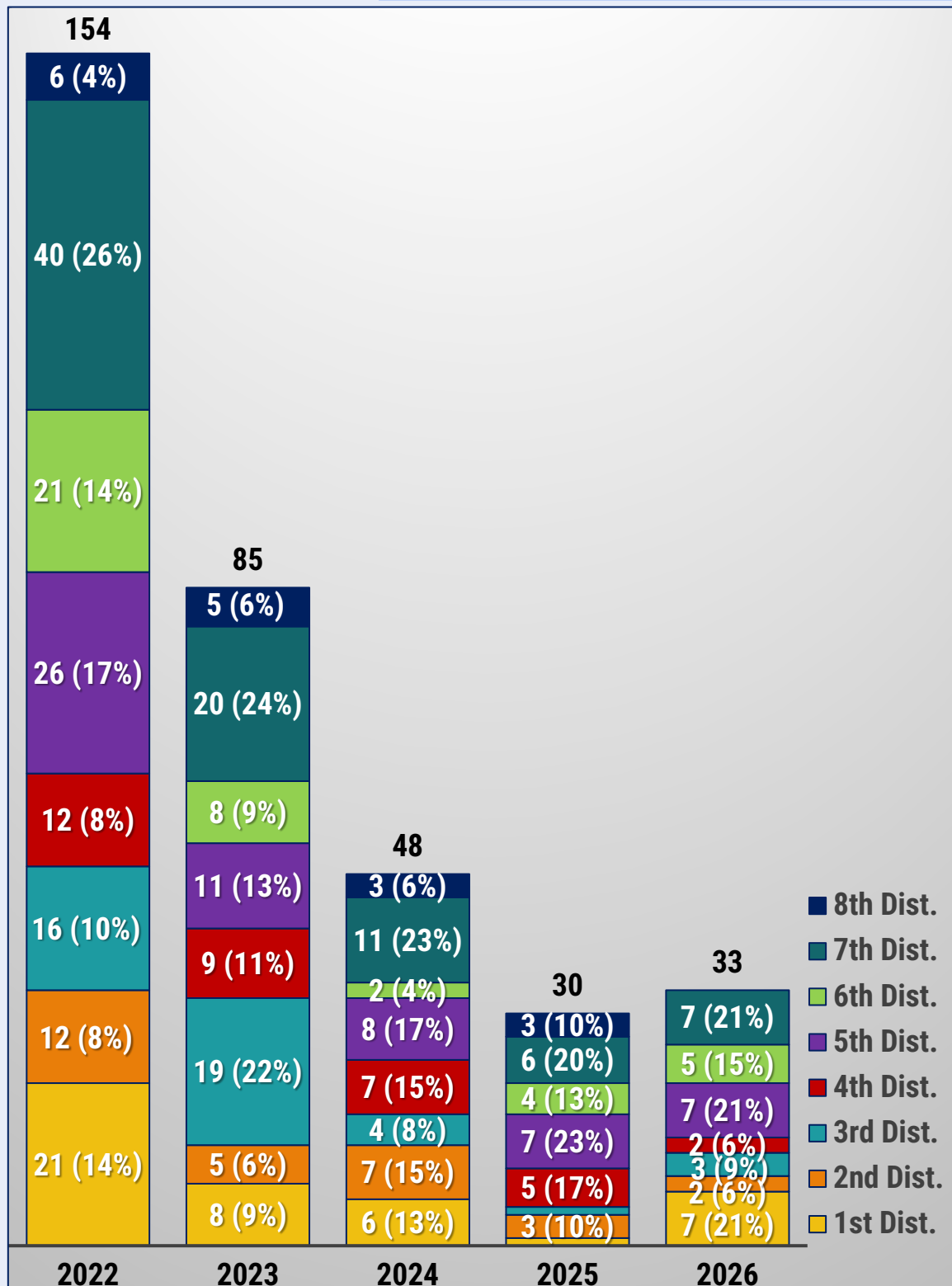

Carjacking was the only violent crime category that saw an increase from 2025-2026, with a total of **three additional carjacking incidents** reported citywide compared with 2025 (+10%). Since 2022, carjacking declined **-79%**, a difference of **121 fewer incidents**.

The **1st District** has been the largest driver of the increase in carjackings in 2026, with six **additional incidents** compared to 2025 (+600%). At seven incidents each, the **1st District**, **5th District**, and **7th District** each accounted for 21% of 2026 carjackings (63% of the citywide total).

The **8th District** reported zero carjacking incidents as of June 30, 2026.

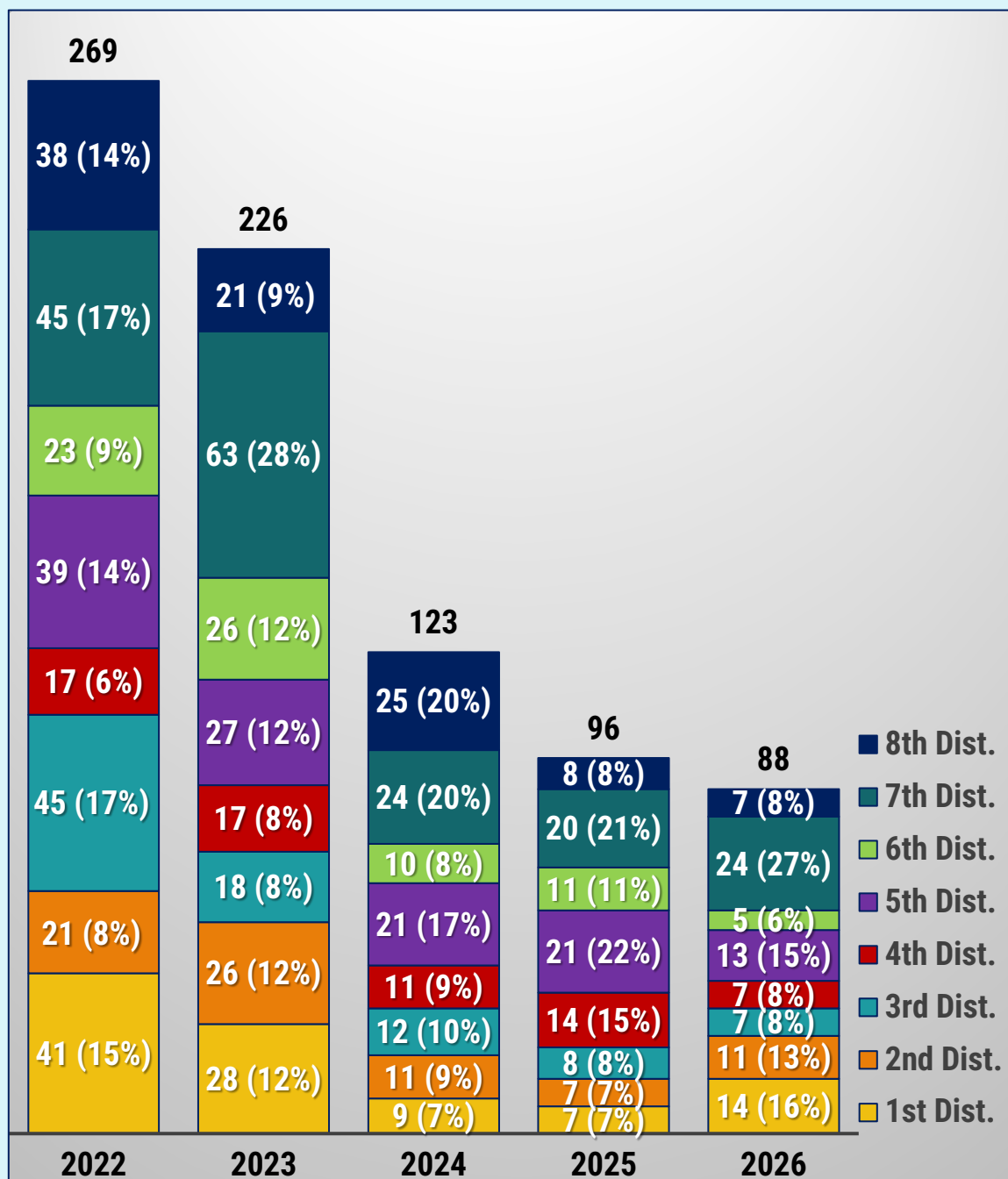

Since reaching a high of 269 incidents in 2022, citywide armed robbery has declined **-67%**, with 181 fewer incidents reported in the first six months of 2026. There has been a decline of -8% citywide since 2025.

Between 2025 and 2026, the **5th District** had the largest reduction of the eight NOPD Districts with **eight fewer armed robberies** (-38%). Compared with 2022, the **5th District** declined -67% in armed robberies with **26 fewer incidents**.

The **3rd District** has shown substantial and steady declines in armed robbery since 2022, with **38 fewer armed robberies** in 2026 (-84%). Compared with 2025, the **3rd District** had **one fewer armed robbery** (-13%).

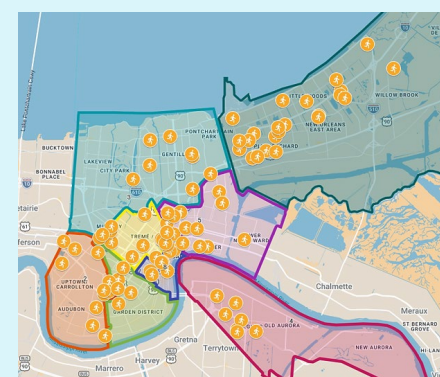
The **1st District** had **seven additional armed robberies** in 2026 compared with 2025 (+100%). The **2nd District** and **7th District** each had **four additional armed robberies** in 2026 compared with 2025 (+57% and +20%, respectively).

The 1st District had the largest increase of **10 additional reported violent crimes in 2026 compared to 2025.**

It had the highest rates of increase in **carjacking** (+6 incidents) and **armed robbery** (+7 incidents) of the eight NOPD Districts from 2025-2026.

Homicides increased by two in 2026 compared with both 2024 and 2025. Compared with 2025, the 1st District reported **five fewer nonfatal shootings** (-56%).

Overall, the 1st District reported **75 fewer violent incidents in 2026 than in 2022** (-71%).

Since reaching a high of 19 homicides in 2023, the 1st District had **13 fewer homicides**, with six victims in the first half of 2026 (-68%).

The 1st District reported **25 fewer nonfatal shootings** in 2026 compared with 2022, a decline of -86%.

The Bayou St. John neighborhood reported fewer violent crimes relative to the rest of the 1st District in 2026.



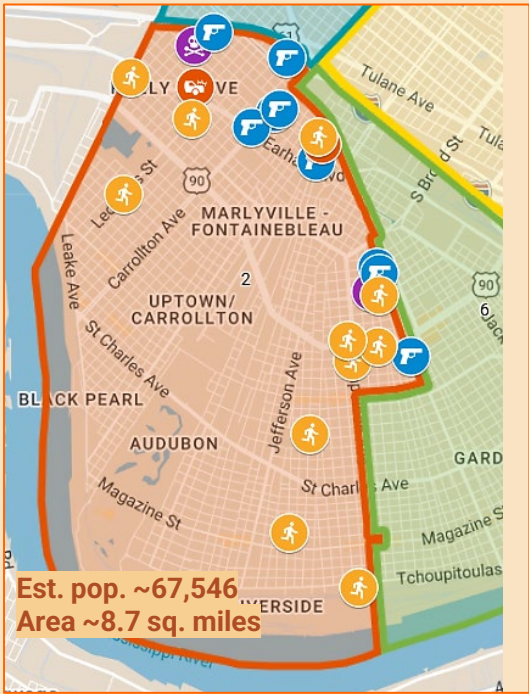

The 2nd District was consistently one of the districts with the fewest reported major violent crimes across the past five years ([MCC District-Level Report, January 2025](#)).

In the first six months of 2026, the 2nd District ranked sixth lowest of eight NOPD Districts on aggregate violent crime.

Compared with 2025, the 2nd District reported **two fewer homicides** and **one fewer carjacking** but had **two additional nonfatal shootings** and **four additional armed robberies**.

There are higher concentrations of **nonfatal shooting** incidents in the Hollygrove area between Earhart Blvd. and Washington Ave.

Armed robbery is the most common violent offense reported in the 2nd District, with higher concentrations in the Broadmoor area near Napoleon and S. Claiborne Avenues.

Over the last five years, the 3rd District accounted for an average of **10%** of citywide violent incidents. There were 72 fewer violent incidents reported in the 3rd District in the first half of 2026 compared with 2022 (-73%).

Compared with 2025, there has been **one additional homicide**, **one additional nonfatal shooting**, and **two additional carjackings** reported in the 3rd District. There was **one fewer armed robbery**.

Higher concentrations of violent crime are noted in Gentilly Woods, near the **5th District** border, along I-610.

A larger concentration of **homicides** and **nonfatal shootings** are seen between Elysian Fields and St. Bernard Avenues as well as from Gentilly Blvd. to the **5th District** border.

Three homicides and one **nonfatal shooting** were reported in the Dixon area, between Canal Street and Airline Hwy, which borders the **2nd District** and Jefferson Parish.

At 21 reported violent incidents through the first six months of 2026, the 4th District is ranked second lowest of the eight NOPD Districts in aggregate violent crime.

Since 2022, aggregate incidents of violent crime declined **-68%**, a difference of 44 incidents.

The 4th District reported one **homicide** in the first six months of 2026, which represents the lowest of any single NOPD District over the past five years (2022-2026).

Compared with 2025, there were **three fewer homicides**, **three fewer carjackings**, and **seven fewer armed robberies**.

Nonfatal shooting incidents increased by two.

Several violent incidents were reported in the McDonough neighborhood near the Crescent City Connection.

A higher concentration of **nonfatal shootings** have been reported along Gen. Meyer Avenue near the Intracoastal Waterway.

Since 2022, the 5th District declined more than **-60%** in every category of major violent crime.

In the first six months of 2026, the 5th District reported **four fewer homicide victims** and **eight fewer armed robberies** compared with 2025. There was no change in rates of **nonfatal shootings** or **carjackings** compared with 2025, though both have declined substantially since 2022 (**-63%** and **-73%**, respectively).

Higher concentrations of **nonfatal shootings** and **armed robberies** were reported near N. Dorgenois and A.P Tureaud Avenue near the **1st District** boundary.

The Bywater area had three **carjackings** and two **armed robberies**, compared to one **carjacking** in the first six months of 2025.

Since reaching a high watermark of 82 reported violent incidents in 2022, the 6th District declined **-66%** (54 fewer incidents) in the first six months of 2026.

Compared with 2025, the 6th District reported **six fewer armed robberies** in the first six months of 2026. However, the District reported **two additional homicide victims, one additional nonfatal shooting, and one additional carjacking** in the first six months of 2026 compared with the first six months of 2025.

Nearly all (25 of 28) incidents of **homicide, nonfatal shooting, carjacking, and armed robbery** in the 6th District were concentrated on the lake side of St. Charles Avenue.

Specifically, the Central City and Hoffman Triangle areas report more violent crime relative to other parts of the District, such as the Lower Garden District.

In 2026, "hotspot" areas include the intersection of Louisiana and Loyola Avenues, and the intersection of Jackson and S. Claiborne Avenues.

Since reaching a high of 208 reported violent incidents in 2022, the 7th District declined **-74%** (153 fewer incidents) in the first six months of 2026. Compared with the same time in 2025, the 7th District had **18 fewer aggregate violent incidents**, tying with the **8th District** for largest raw number decline from January-June 30, 2026.

The citywide decline in nonfatal shooting incidents is largely due to the substantial decline (-61%) in the 7th District. Specifically, the 7th District had 20 fewer nonfatal shooting incidents in the first six months of 2026 compared with 2025.

Although still ranked first of the eight NOPD Districts for having the most **homicide victims** in the first six months of 2026, the 7th District had **three fewer homicide victims** compared with 2025.

The 7th District accounted for 27% of citywide **armed robberies** in 2026, more than any other NOPD District.

Clusters of **armed robbery** are noted along Chef Highway, Downman Road, and Bullard Avenue.

Other "hotspot" areas include small sections of the Lincoln Beach and Willow Brook neighborhoods.

Since 2022, the 8th District has declined across all four categories of major violent crime.

Armed robbery had the largest (-82%) decline in the 8th District during the first six months of 2026.

From 2025-2026, there were **13 fewer homicide victims** in the 8th District. The high number of **homicide victims** in 2025 was largely the result of the Bourbon Street Terror Attack.

The 8th District reported no carjackings were reported in the first six months of 2026.

A higher concentration of **nonfatal shootings** and **armed robberies** is noted in the French Quarter along Bourbon Street between Iberville and Conti Streets.

Two **nonfatal shootings** and a **homicide victim** were reported near Tulane and Loyola Avenues.

Compared with prior years, reported violent crime past Toulouse Street in the French Quarter has significantly declined.
